THE BROADLAND BOAT-TRAIN



Unique to the Bure Valley Railway, the combination of the nostalgic trip by steam train through the Broadland Countryside and the boat journey from Wroxham through the Beautiful Broads all adds up to a great day out for all ages.

The BOAT-TRAIN leaves Aylsham Station at 10.15 every day between 10th May and the 5th September. After arriving at our Wroxham Station there is a short stroll to Wroxham Bridge where the Boat departs for a 1½ hour cruise. The boat arrives back at about 1.00. There is no rush to catch the train to Aylsham as you can return on any train. The inclusive price of £8.00 saves you £2.40 on the normal cost.

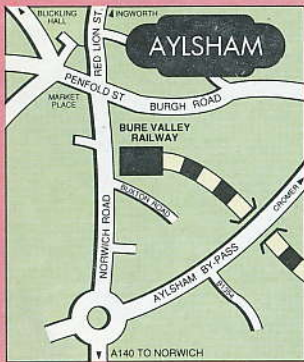
THE BLICKLING HERITAGE LINK



Enjoy the Bure Valley Railway and the National Trust's Blickling Hall on the same day. The train departs Wroxham Station for Blickling at 11.15 every Wednesday from the 13th May until 15th July and every Tuesday and Wednesday from the 21st July until 2nd September. A free coach takes you to Blickling just 1½ miles away for a tour of the House and Gardens. The coach then returns in time to catch the 4.15 departure back to Wroxham. The price including the Blickling tour is only £8.50 a saving of £2.25 on the normal cost, making this a very special day out. (Further savings available for N.T. members).

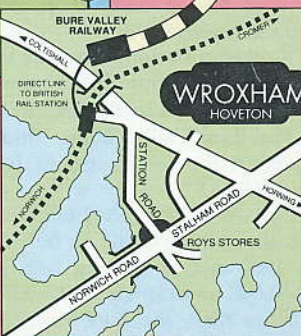
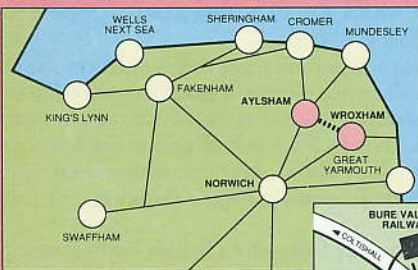

Step aboard the Bure Valley Railway for a journey to remember — a journey through unspoilt Norfolk countryside and beautiful Broadland villages on East Anglia's newest narrow-gauge railway.

The nine-mile Bure Valley line links historic Aylsham with the bustling Broadland town of Wroxham, the 40 minute journey treating passengers to some of the finest scenery Norfolk can offer.

Between the two main stations are three request halts at the villages of Brampton, Buxton and Coltishall, where the guard will gladly stop to pick you up, or drop you off.

Built to a very high standard, the carriages provide one the best rides of any narrow-gauge railway, and the station facilities at both ends of the line are second-to-none.

Bure Valley's headquarters are at Aylsham, where there is free parking for 150 cars, an 80-seat coffee shop, model railway exhibition, gift shop selling souvenirs, railway books and videos.

Wroxham station, linked by footpath to British Rail's station, is just five minutes walk from the centre of the town and provides an ideal opportunity for those enjoying boating holidays on the Broads to make a leisurely exploration of the countryside.

The Bure Valley Walk, which follows the line of the railway, offers the more energetic the opportunity to discover the delights of the area on foot—part of the way at least!

Opened in 1990, the Bure Valley line was the first 15-inch railway to be built with a Light Railway Order for 60 years. Planning began in 1986, the order was obtained in 1989 and 12 months later Norfolk had a new railway line, complete with a £200,000 tunnel under Aylsham's bypass.

Since then, the Bure Valley Railway has been providing bags of enjoyment for holiday visitors and local people alike, all of whom are finding that they've never had so much fun getting from A to B.
