# What you need to know...



## ▶ TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

### Identity Card/Passport and Customs' Formalities:

Passports should be valid for 6 months after your return. It is your responsibility to obtain all information regarding the various documents you will require before you embark your cruise ship. If you are arriving at an airport to join your ship you should have all the appropriate documentation to be allowed to enter the country. You should be in possession of a valid Passport or ID card to travel abroad. Should you require visas for any part of your cruise make sure you obtain them before embarkation. Should you require a Schengen visa it should be multi entry.

**IMPORTANT:** U.S. passport holders visiting Libya MUST obtain a visa from their country of residence. Passengers requiring a Schengen visa MUST have a multi entry Schengen visa.

### Cruise documentation:

You should have with you at all times prior embarkation all the cruise documents given to you by your Travel Agent (cruise tickets/Vouchers, excursions program, insurance policy, conditions of carriage etc.).

### Travel Insurance:

Luggage insurance is an important consideration, since airlines and Louis Cruises have a limited liability for loss or damage.



### Luggage:

We strongly recommend the use of security locks for your luggage for all parts of your journey. Jewellery, medication, travel documents and Passport/ID card should

be kept in your hand luggage. All luggage should be clearly labelled, do not forget to specify your name and cabin number on the luggage labels.

### Lost, stolen or damaged luggage:

The company is not responsible for any loss or damage to your luggage during transit to the ship. In case of loss or damage advise the carriers involved and your insurance company.

### Health Requirements:

Check with your Travel Agent or your doctor regarding the health requirements of the countries to be visited. We may require in certain cases a letter "fit to travel" from your physician. Please always advise us of any medical problems prior to booking your cruise.

### Medication:

If you require prescription medication ensure that you bring an ample supply as some prescription drugs may not be available onboard. If your medication requires cold storage, please inform [paxserv@louis cruises.gr](mailto:paxserv@louis cruises.gr) no later than two weeks prior to departure. It's a good idea to bring a spare pair of spectacles or contact lenses if you use them.



### Pregnancy:

Ladies 6 months pregnant or more are not allowed to cruise for their own health & safety reasons. Up to the fifth month of pregnancy pregnant ladies may cruise, but are required to present prior to embarkation a statement from their physician stating that they are able to travel. Minimum age of infants: 3 months. Should you need a baby cot, please inform us via your travel agent at least one month before sailing. Please note that we do not provide baby formula or food. We do not have a babysitting service onboard.



### Personal Expenses:

The currency on board is the Euro. For your convenience the vessels operate a cashless system. Your personal embarkation card allows you to charge almost everything onboard, including shore excursions, gift shop purchases, wine and bar bills, spa and beauty salon, photos, cabin service in fact everything except those transactions made in the Casino. Upon embarkation you should contact the Guest Relations desk in order to activate your personal account. We recommend all credit card holders to register their card to settle their account and assist them in a smooth check-out, avoiding lines. The credit cards accepted on board are: American Express, MasterCard and Visa. For those passengers not wishing to pay by credit card payment can be made by cash or Travellers' Cheques. At the end of the cruise you will receive in your cabin an invoice itemising all your expenses.



Note: All expenses incurred the last day of the cruise will be paid in cash. Please note we not accept Debit cards or personal cheques.

### Gratuities:

For your convenience and as per practice on most cruise ships, your on board account will be debited with the following customary gratuities: for services rendered on board the suggested amounts are Euros 8 per person per day for all passengers over 16 years old and Euro 4 per person per day for children and teenagers (6-16 years).

### Diet requirements:

If you have a particular diet requirement please email us at [paxserv@louis cruises.gr](mailto:paxserv@louis cruises.gr) or advise your travel agent to instruct us no later than two weeks prior departure.

### Are you celebrating a Birthday, Anniversary or honeymoon?:

Email us in advance at [paxserv@louis cruises.gr](mailto:paxserv@louis cruises.gr) or advise your travel agent to instruct us no later than two weeks prior departure.

### Bon Voyage Gifts:

Would you like to send a gift of fruit, flowers or wine? A gift certificate for use in the Beauty salon, Cocktail parties, renewal of wedding vows, special celebration gifts for your clients, family or friends. email [paxserv@louis cruises.gr](mailto:paxserv@louis cruises.gr) for full details.

### Optional Shore Excursions:

A variety of comprehensive land tours have been arranged in the various ports of call, ask your Travel Agent for details. More information can be obtained from our experienced Shore excursion personnel onboard the vessel. Shore excursions can be purchased onboard and charged to your ship-board Account.

### Pets:

For health reasons, pets are not permitted onboard our ships.



## ▶ WHAT TO PACK

### Day wear:

Casual light-weight resort wear, including light cotton clothing is recommended, swimwear and a beach robe. When in public areas or the restaurants, swimsuits are not allowed. If however you wish to have lunch in your swim attire you can enjoy a buffet meal on deck.

Tennis shoes or low heeled walking shoes are best for exploring the ports of call. A light jacket or sweater in case of that unexpected rain shower or too cold A/C. A hat and sunglasses are always recommended. Binoculars will be a great asset to your enjoyment whilst at sea and during the excursions, of course have your camera ready at all times. During Excursions if visiting places of worship, shorts are not allowed and shoulders should be covered.



After 6:00 p.m.: The ship board daily program will inform you of the dress code on board after 6.00 p.m. The majority of evenings onboard are country club casual.

Dress guidelines: Casual night: Country club casual clothing, we want you to feel comfortable and relaxed.

Formal: Gentlemen we suggest suit & tie and the ladies cocktail dress or pant suit for nights of glamour!

## ▶ ARRIVAL AT THE PORT

Important reminder do not pack passports, travel documents, prescription medication or valuables. Please check the sailing times and allow enough time to reach the ship. Passengers who are not at the check in 1 hour prior departure are considered as no – show.

Allow sufficient time from your flight arrival at the airport to the port taking into consideration the possible traffic jams on the way.

### Embarkation Procedures:

Embarkation commences three hours before the departure time of the vessel. Passport/ID card, cruise ticket or voucher should be ready to present to the embarkation staff. For security reasons and to allow for fast embarkation/disembarkation at each port of call, the ship's staff collects and holds your Passport/ Identity card for the whole cruise. A



receipt will be given to you and should be presented at the designated time when Passports/ID cards will be returned to you prior to disembarkation. At embarkation you will be issued with your own personal embarkation card which acts as your on board payment card and the security for embarking and disembarking the vessel.

\* Alcohol purchased ashore will be kept in safe lock up and returned to you on the night prior to your disembarkation.

## ▶ ON BOARD

### Luggage assistance:

Your luggage will be delivered outside your cabin door. Please allow 1 - 2 hours for delivery of all luggage. If you have not received your luggage within this time period, or if you have not indicated the cabin number on your luggage, please speak with our guest relations personnel.

### Dining Room Reservations:

Upon embarkation, the Maitre d'Hotel will take your dining room reservation and assign your table. You will have the choice, depending on availability, of main or late sitting. Times vary depending on the arrival and departure times at the ports of call but they are always mentioned in the Daily Program. Breakfast and lunch do not require any reservation; they are free sittings and therefore you can choose between the buffet on the open deck or the restaurant. For dinner, we kindly ask you to respect the opening time of the restaurant. Smoking is not permitted in the Dining Room.

### Valuables:

Safety boxes for your valuable items, jewellery, money and documents are available on board all our ships either in the cabin or at the Purser's Office. There is a nominal charge. The company is not responsible for any theft or loss of any items not kept in the safety boxes. The company does not accept responsibility for loss or theft of cameras, video cameras, chargers and other valuable electrical items which are your responsibility at all times.

## ▶ FOR YOUR INFORMATION

### Daily Program:

Each evening, a program detailing the following day's activities will be delivered to your cabin. This will include excursion departure times, arrival and departure times, social activities, meal times, opening hours of the onboard services, evening dress code and other useful information. Please read it carefully.



### Guest Relations Office:

Our onboard personnel will be pleased to help you and answer all your questions. The Guest Relations Office is open 24 hours a day.

### Electric Current:

The current on board our ships 110v AC or 220, please remember to bring a transformer. Check our website for each ships particulars [www.louis-cruises.com](http://www.louis-cruises.com)



### Smoking policy:

All our lounges are divided into smoking and non smoking areas. The dining room is a non smoking area. Cigar smokers are kindly requested not to smoke in enclosed areas. Passengers are requested, for safety & health reasons, not to smoke in cabins.



### Laundry and pressing:

A laundry and pressing service is available on board our vessels. Complete the form, place the clothing in the laundry bag provided your cabin steward will do the rest. Your onboard account will be charged accordingly.

### Pool towels:

Cabin personnel will provide you with enough towels for your party in your cabin, which will be replaced when needed. Passengers are kindly requested to return the used towels back to their cabins. In case you fail to do so, your onboard account will be charged automatically with the amount of 20 Euros per piece.



### Visitors:

Due to security reasons and the comfort of other passengers, visitors are not allowed on board.

Customs regulations do not allow us to open whilst in port. \*Liquor purchased will be delivered to your cabin on the last day of the cruise.



### Photography Services:

All your unforgettable experiences on excursions and on board will be photographed by our professional team of photographers. All photos will then be displayed at the Photo Gallery.

### Casino:

During your cruise, try your luck with Slot Machines, at the tables with Roulette, Black Jack and Bingo!! Minimum age 18 years. Note: Your personal embarkation/charge card cannot be used in the casino.



### Internet Facilities:

The ships have internet facilities which are charged to your shipboard account.

### Medical Facilities:

There is a physician available onboard 24 hours a day while at sea and during scheduled hours when the Vessel is in port. Professional service, care and medication is offered by our ships physician.
